STEP 1

Colour or decorate the shapes provided on the template and carefully cut them out.



STEP 2

Using coloured pens or pencils, draw a background for your dream holiday on a piece of paper or card as you prefer.



STEP 3

Using your Pritt Stick, glue the items to your paper or card. You could also use cut outs from magazines to add to your dream holiday scene!



MAKE YOUR OWN DREAM HOLIDAY





Colour and carefully cut out the healthy food in the template to fill the cupboard.









STEP 2

Measure the white paper and carefully cut out a 20x20cm piece. Then measure the card and carefully cut out a 40x20cm piece.



Use your Pritt Stick to glue the white paper on to the center of the card. Fold the sides of the card to the center to create cupboard doors.



Draw three lines on the white paper. This will form the cupboard shelves.



STEP Glue the food to the shelves and now you have your healthy food cupboard ready!

Take a toilet roll tube and using your Pritt Stick, glue paper or foil around the tube.


NAKE YOUR OWN RECYCLED ROBOT


Colour or decorate the shapes provided on the template and carefully cut them out.



STEP .

Using your coloured pens or pencils, colour or decorate the shapes provided on the template and carefully cut them out.

STEP 2

Fold your paper plate in half and carefully cut through the middle. Then, paint the paper plate and make sure you leave enough time for the paint to dry!



STEP 3

Using your Pritt Stick, glue the three mask shapes, one on top of the other, and then glue them to the paper plate.



STEP 4

Finally, using your Pritt Stick, glue the decorations to your paper plate mask. You could also use confetti!



MAKE YOUR OWN PAPER PLATE MASK





ALAKE YOUR OWN ACTIVITY WHEEL

STEP 1

Using your coloured pens or pencils, colour the triangles, action boxes and arrow provided on the template and carefully cut them out.

STEP 2

Using your Pritt Stick, glue the triangles around the circle and then, glue the activity names on top. This will form the wheel.



STEP 3

Glue the cork to the center of the wheel using your Pritt Stick.

STEP 4

Carefully attach the arrow to the cork using a pushpin. Now, the arrow can rotate through the wheel. Spin the wheel and enjoy completing





Colour the animals in the template using coloured pens or pencils and carefully cut them out.

STEP 2

Using your Pritt Stick, glue the animals to the centre of the shapes provided in the second template.



STEP 3

Make rings by gluing one end of the shape to the other with your Pritt Stick.

STEP 4

Now they can stand up and be placed one inside the other. Enjoy playing with your nesting dolls and make sure to show them to your friends!
